Title I, Part D Funding Period

- Funds awarded July 1 each year (example: FY25 funds awarded July 1, 2025)
- Funds available for 27 months (through September 30 two years after award)
- Liquidation period through January 30 of the following year
- After liquidation period, you will be contacted if there are funds remaining, in order to close out the grant.
- Example of FY 2021 Award:
 - July 1, 2021: ED awarded funds to States
 - September 30, 2023: end of obligation period
 - January 30, 2024: end of liquidation (drawdown) period
 - March 30, 2025: end of Phase 1 liquidation period
